

AUSTRALIAN AND STATE TITLES CONDITIONS – RACES

For General Conditions for Australian Titles, see “General Regulations of CAMS” in the CAMS Manual of Motor Sport.

GENERAL CONDITIONS

1. STATUS

Australian Championships will have precedence over National Series followed in order of hierarchy by other National events, State Championships and other events.

2. CONDUCT

- 2.1 Australian Championships and National Series shall be marketed and promoted by Category Managers under licence from CAMS. State Championships shall be subject to approval by the relevant State Council.
- 2.2 All Australian Championships, National Series, National events and State Championships shall comply with these minimum requirements and as further approved in Sporting and Technical Regulations for the relevant Championship or Series.

3. DRIVER ELIGIBILITY

For Australian Championships all drivers must hold the minimum of a National Circuit Licence unless specifically approved otherwise by CAMS. For other than Australian Championships all drivers must hold the minimum of a Provisional Circuit Licence.

4. EVENTS

- 4.1 Australian Championships must be contested over a minimum of six rounds in not fewer than four States unless otherwise approved by CAMS.
- 4.2 National Series must be contested over a maximum of eight rounds in more than one State unless otherwise approved by CAMS.
- 4.3 For categories without an Australian Championship or National Series a single National event is encouraged.
- 4.4 State Championships must be contested within the territory of the applicable State Council, however with the approval of adjoining State Councils, one interstate event may be included as a round of a State Championship.

5. REGULATIONS

- 5.1 Sporting and Technical Regulations for all Australian Championships, National Series and Nationals are subject to consideration and approval by CAMS through the Australian Motor Racing Commission.
- 5.2 Sporting regulations for State Championships are subject to consideration and approval by CAMS through the relevant State Council. Where a State Council wishes to conduct a Championship for a sub-category of categories listed in this manual, Technical regulations are subject to review by the Australian Motor Racing Commission.

6. RACE FORMAT

- 6.1 All Championships and Series may be contested over single or multiple races at each round subject to approval in the applicable Sporting Regulations.
- 6.2 For Australian and State Championships each race shall commence from a massed grid start, either standing or rolling start. Handicap starts based on an approved class structure are permissible where approved in Sporting Regulations, however reverse grid formats are not permissible.
- 6.3 For National Series and Nationals, each race shall commence from a massed grid start, either standing or rolling start. Handicap starts are permissible where approved in Sporting Regulations. Reverse grid formats are permissible only where the fastest 50% and slowest 50% are reversed within their respective groups.

7. POINTS

- 7.1 Unless otherwise approved in Sporting Regulations, the default pointscore structure for Australian Championships shall be:

1st	10 points	5th	4 points
2nd	8 points	6th	3 points
3rd	6 points	7th	2 points
4th	5 points	8th	1 point

- 7.2 If an alternate pointscore is approved, the scale of points shall be weighted to favour the top three outright positions with remaining points awarded on a diminishing scale.
- 7.3 For other than Australian Championships, Article 7.1 is strongly encouraged for the pointscore structure.
- 7.4 Where multiple races are contested at each round of a Championship/Series, the points from each race shall be aggregated to determine the round winner. In the event of ties for points in a round of a Championship or Series, a comparison of race results will determine the outcome with the final race for a round taking precedence, further details of which will be approved in Sporting Regulations.
- 7.5 In the event of ties for points in a Championship or Series, a countback will determine the outcome, the details of which will be approved in Sporting Regulations.

8. AWARDS

- 8.1 For Australian Championships, the outright winner of the Championship shall be recognised as an “Australian Champion”. Where classes are contested as part of the Championship, the winners shall be recognised as “Class Winners”.
- 8.2 For National Series and Nationals, the outright winner shall be recognised as the “Series Winner”. Where classes are contested as part of the Series or Nationals, the winners shall be recognised as “Class Winners”.
- 8.3 For State Championships, the outright winner of the Championship shall be recognised as a “State Champion”. Where classes are contested as part of the Championship, the winners shall be recognised as “Class Winners”.
