

GENERAL REGULATIONS OF CAMS

Licences

Important note: Membership of a CAMS-affiliated Enthusiast Club does not enable the member to hold a licence. If a competition licence is required, membership of an affiliated car club which is able to conduct competitions is necessary.

An applicant who wishes to compete in more than one discipline (eg, circuit and rally) must have each discipline endorsed on his licence.

1. GRANT OF LICENCE

CAMS shall be entitled to issue licences to:

- (i) its nationals; and
- (ii) a national of another country represented on the FIA in compliance with the following statutory conditions:
 - (a) that his parent ASN gives its prior agreement on the issuing which may only take place once a year and in special cases; and
 - (b) that he produces to his parent ASN (the country of his passport) a proof of permanent residence in Australia; and
 - (c) that his parent ASN has cancelled any licence originally issued.

For details and special conditions, see Article 110 of the FIA International Sporting Code at www.fia.com.

No person authorised by his parent ASN to apply for a CAMS licence shall hold a licence from that ASN valid for the current year.

2. RESTRICTIONS ON THE HOLDING OF COMPETITION LICENCES

- (i) a person may only hold one driver/navigator licence issued by CAMS at any time.
- (ii) a person or body may only hold one competitor licence issued by CAMS at any time.

3. COMPETITION LICENCE EXPIRY DATES

At first issue, competition licences, except international, will be given a 12-month expiry date. This will become the permanent expiry date.

International licences expire on 31 December in accordance with the ISC.

4. LICENCE PHOTOGRAPHS - CLUBMAN, NATIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL LICENCES

At first issue, licence applications (not renewals) must be accompanied by a current passport-size photograph. The photograph shall be renewed every 10 years.

5. CAMS MANUAL OF MOTOR SPORT

Each competition licence holder shall receive the CAMS Manual of Motor Sport which includes the NCR.

6. MEDICAL FITNESS

A copy of CAMS' Medical Standards is available from CAMS.

Each applicant for a competition licence must comply with CAMS' medical criteria relevant to their competition level – the requirements for which are included on the licence application form.

Where applicants do not meet these criteria, medical reports will be referred to the relevant State Medical Assessor for a decision on competition fitness.

Should any medical condition become evident during the currency of the licence the holder shall notify CAMS. It may become necessary for the licence to be suspended and may only be reinstated following further medical examination as determined by CAMS.

6.1 Licence Levels PCC, CC, PC, NC Circuit Racing and Historic; PSK, NSK Superkart and NOS Off Road Stadium

At first issue, applicants for these licences will be required to be medically examined by a **general practitioner**, CAMS Approved Medical Examiner (CAME) or a Designated Aviation Medical Examiner (DAME). Those Applicants **over** 45 years of age are required to undergo a medical examination every second year, which includes tests, unless annual medical examinations are requested by the State Medical Assessor. CAMS medical reports **must** will be completed by the CAME or DAME and **must** be forwarded with the licence application to the CAMS Customer Services department.

6.2 International Competition Licences

6.3 National Competition Licences

Each applicant shall complete a Health Statement which forms part of the licence application.

7. NATIONALITY

Deleted 2008 – refer Article 1, above.

8. LICENCE FEE

Competition licence fees shall be payable in accordance with the Schedule of Fees (Appendix R) available from the CAMS website (www.cams.com.au).

9. DISCRETION

The granting of a licence or the upgrading of a licence is at the sole discretion of CAMS.

10. REFUSAL OF LICENCE

CAMS may refuse to issue a licence and may make such endorsement as it sees fit on a licence without stating any reasons for doing so.

11. WITHDRAWAL OF LICENCE

CAMS may withdraw a licence in accordance with the NCR in which case the licence shall be returned to CAMS within two working days.

12. VALIDITY OF LICENCE

A driver or navigator licence issued by CAMS is valid only when the holder is a current member of a CAMS-affiliated club (other than any affiliated Enthusiast Club) demonstrated by the production of a valid club membership.

With the approval of CAMS and in accordance with the ISC, the holder of a CAMS international licence may compete in competitions appearing on the FIA International Sporting Calendar. Additionally, holders of a current CAMS national or international licence may participate in national level events overseas at the discretion of the authorising ASN.

13. PRODUCTION OF LICENCE

A competition licence holder shall produce his licence, signed by the holder, on the request of a relevant official of the meeting.

However, the Stewards of the Meeting may permit a licence holder to participate without producing his licence upon the payment of a fine; provided the Stewards of the Meeting are satisfied a valid licence is held.

14. DRUGS

CAMS has adopted the Australian Sports Commission's policy on drugs in sport, which is in accordance with the FIA regulations (refer Policy on the CAMS website – www.cams.com.au). The World Anti-Doping Authority list of prohibited substances.

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15. LICENCE PERFORMANCE AND SKILL CRITERIA

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16. MINIMUM AGE FOR LICENCES

Motorkhana

Khanacross

- **Level 1 Licence** No driver shall be under the age of ~~12~~ **16** years. Assessment by the Clerk of the Course or nominated Official prior to participation.
- **Level 2SJ and 2NSJ Licences**

No driver shall be under the age of ~~12~~ **14** years. **Drivers 12 and 13 years of age must be accompanied by an experienced instructor, as approved by the Clerk of the Course. It is recommended that 12- and 13-year-old drivers participate in a Junior Development Program or CAMS Ignition Program before competing in Khanacross events.** ~~Drivers between 14 and 16 must have competed previously in motorkhana.~~

Junior licences remain valid until their expiry date regardless of whether the member is deemed an adult for that licence.

17a. LEVEL 1 LICENCE

Can be purchased once per annum and is valid for use at one event only. A Level 1 licence permits the holder to participate in non-competition events conducted by CAMS-affiliated clubs (other than any affiliated Enthusiast Club) and CAMS-permitted event organisers as single-event member recruitment promotions or as a specific non-competitive part of a competitive event.

17b. LEVEL 2S AND 2NS LICENCES

Clubs affiliated with CAMS (other than any affiliated Enthusiast Club) will be issued with Level 2S and 2NS licences application forms.

Club members who hold current Level 2S and 2NS licences or who have held Levels 2S and 2NS licences within a 12-month period are not permitted to complete further licence application forms through their club. They are to contact CAMS and request a renewal form.

Holders of Level 2S licences will be entitled to enter the following events:

- regularity trials up to National Championship
- single- and multi-car speed events up to International level
- some touring road events – refer “Rally/Road” section in the CAMS Manual of Motor Sport, Touring Road Event Regulations and
- all events available to Level 2NS licence holders.

Holders of Level 2NS licences will be entitled to enter the following events:

- observed section trials
- touring road events which contain no closed road sections and no speed sub-events
- touring assemblies (in which the competitor and at least one crew member shall hold a minimum of a Level 2NS Licence)
- introductory rallies as approved by the relevant State Manager of CAMS
- motorkhana and khanacross events up to International level
- drifting events.

17c. SINGLE EVENT LICENCES

Level 2SE

A Level 2SE (single event) licence is available to members of CAMS-affiliated car clubs (other than any affiliated Enthusiast Club) in the following situations:

- a single event where Level 2 licences applies;
- a meeting where a number of events are included on the one permit, provided the events are conducted within a three-day period;
- a regularity trial included within a race meeting program, the Level 2SE licence will be valid for the regularity trial only.

Minimum age is 14.

Application is made by contacting the event organiser.

Level NOSE (Off Road Driver Single Event)

A single event licence is available to Off Road drivers in events up to and including State Championship level. Application can be made at the event.

Minimum age for the licence is 14 years. Participation depends upon level of competition.

Observed licence Test (OLT) during prologue will be required.

Attend an additional pre-event briefing covering the significant aspects of the Pre-Licence Lecture with a particular focus on safety issues of Off Road events.

Level NONSE (Off Road Navigator Single Event)

A single-event licence is available to off road navigators in events up to and including State Championship

level. Application can be made at the event. Minimum age for the licence is 12. Participation depends upon level of competition. **Applicants must attend an additional pre-event briefing covering the significant aspects of the Pre-Licence Lecture with a particular focus on safety issues of Off Road events.**

Level NRSE (Rally Driver Single Event)

A single event licence is available to rally drivers in events up to and including National Championship level. Application is to be made through CAMS Customer Services and the applicant must comply with pre-licence conditions detailed in Article 15e of Licences in the General Regulations of CAMS. To ensure timely completion of the process, application must arrive with Customer Services within seven days prior to documentation. Minimum age for the licence is 14. Participation depends upon the level of competition.

Level NRNSE (Rally Navigator Single Event)

A single-event licence is available to rally navigators in events up to and including National level.

Application is to be made through CAMS Customer Services and the applicant must successfully complete a Rally Licence Lecture prior to the event. To ensure timely completion of the process, applications must arrive with CAMS Customer Services seven days prior to Documentation.

Minimum age for the licence is 14. Participation depends upon the level of competition.

Level P/NCSE

A 'single-event' upgrade is available to allow Clubman Circuit (CC) licence holders to compete in a single nominated event for which a National Circuit (NC) licence is required, but without having to complete a full licence upgrade. Likewise, Provisional Clubman Circuit (PCC) licence holders will also be able to use the 'single-event' upgrade to compete in a single nominated event for which a Provisional Circuit (PC) licence is required.

Applications must be made through CAMS Customer Services and the applicant must hold either a current PCC or CC licence. To ensure timely completion of the process, applications must be sent to CAMS Customer Services seven days prior to event documentation.

18. COMPETITOR LICENCES - LEVELS J, K, L, M, N & O

Competition vehicle owners who are not the holders of a driver/entrant licence must hold a Level J, K, L, M, N or O Competitor licence.

Competitor licences may be issued to individuals, companies, groups and teams who are the holders of current CAMS log books:

- **Level J** - individual persons
- **Level K** - company, group or team
- **Level L** - publicly-listed company
- **Level M** - individual person who enters a vehicle in any international competition; ie, race, rally etc.
- **Level N** - company, group or team which enters a vehicle in any international competition; ie, race, rally etc.
- **Level O** - publicly-listed company which enters a vehicle in any international competition; ie, race, rally etc.

A club affiliated with CAMS, sponsors, teams etc, may be shown in the program, results etc as the Competitor without being required to hold a Competitor licence.

Applicants for Competitor licences must, where relevant, submit evidence of incorporation and provide an ACN or registration of business name at the time of application.

19. LEVEL C3 HISTORIC & LEVEL C4 HISTORIC CIRCUIT RACING LICENCES

Deleted 2004.

20. PRE-LICENCE LECTURE - CIRCUIT RACING, SUPERKART, OFF ROAD AND NATIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL RALLY

Following assessment of the Medical Examination or Medical Statement, applicants must undertake a lecture on the requirements of the CAMS Manual of Motor Sport and the procedures involved in their motor sport competition. Lecture dates will be advised to applicants by CAMS State offices or the lecture can be completed on-line. Registrations for on-line lectures can be made by contacting CAMS Customer Services on 1300 653 529. The satisfactory completion of the on-line lecture, will be recorded by CAMS. The observed licence test must be completed within a year of completing the driver lecture.

21. OBSERVED LICENCE TESTING - CIRCUIT RACING, SUPERKART, OFF ROAD AND NATIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL RALLY

Prior to licence issue, applicants for these licences must have their driving ability assessed by a CAMS-appointed observer.

Observed licence testing procedures will be advised to applicants by the relevant CAMS State Office or as detailed on the Pre-Licence Authority. On satisfactory completion of the observed licence test, applicants' Pre-Licence Authority will be signed by the CAMS-appointed observer.

Note: Additional Licence Categories:

– Circuit Racing and Superkarting

PSK or NSK Superkart licence holders may only transfer to or add a Circuit Racing licence discipline to their licence at PCC/PC level by undertaking the following:

- be observed by Stewards or the Clerk of the Course at official practice at a Circuit Racing event of less than National Championship status
- have CAMS Pass Book signed **as "obs ok"** by Stewards or the Clerk of the Course

- return CAMS Pass Book to CAMS Customer Services **along with the Supplementary Application form** for licence re-issue.

All other conditions relating to the issue of a PCC/PC circuit racing licence must be met, eg, age limits etc.

An NSK category may be added to a CC/NC licence by the completion of a **Supplementary Licence Application form** which must be sent to CAMS Customer Services for licence re-issue.

PCC/PC Circuit Racing licence holders may transfer to or add a Superkart discipline to their licence at PSK level by undertaking the following:

- be observed by Stewards or the Clerk of the Course at official practice at a Superkart event of less than National Championship status
- have CAMS Pass Book signed **as “obs ok”** by Stewards or the Clerk of the Course
- return CAMS Pass Book to CAMS Customer Services **along with the Supplementary Application form** for licence re-issue.

All other conditions relating to the issue of a PSK licence must be met, eg, age limits etc.

– National Off Road

National Off Road competitors may transfer/add a National Rally licence discipline to their licence by:

- Undertaking the Rally licence lecture
- Forwarding documentary evidence of competing in at least two Off Road events in the previous two years. This evidence can be race results, signed passbook or a statutory declaration from the event’s Clerk of the Course or Stewards stating the title and date of the event.

– National Rally

National Rally competitors may transfer/add a National Off Road licence discipline to their licence by:

- Undertaking the Off Road licence lecture.
- Forwarding documentary evidence of competing in at least two Rally events in the previous two years. This evidence can be rally results, signed pass book or a statutory declaration from the event’s Clerk of the Course or Stewards stating the title and date of the event.

New rally competitors over 25 years of age who have held a civil driver’s licence for at least five years are not required to complete the Observed Licence Test (OLT).

For licence applicants under the age of 25 and with no competition experience in other motor sport disciplines they are to undertake a Rally Licence Lecture and the required number of Observed Licence Tests (OLT) at which driving style, ability and attitudes are evaluated. Alternatively they may attend an advanced driver course and have the instructor sign off that the licence applicant has received instruction in the basic skills identified in the OLT checklist. Pre-Licence Authority form is to be signed at the lecture and OLT.

After the completion of the OLT (where applicable) and Rally Licence Lecture a **Provisional** licence will be issued ~~in the first instance.~~

During the first year of issue the licence shall be considered provisional. Subsequent licence renewals may be subject to review by CAMS.

~~The Provisional Licence shall be endorsed by the Clerk of the Course following successful participation in a rally. After three endorsements the licence may be upgraded from provisional status upon application by the holder.~~

It is highly recommended, but not mandatory, that the applicant complete an advanced driver training course (with an emphasis on teaching the skills likely to be needed in rally competitors – eg, controlling a car on loose surfaces) prior to entering competition.

It is highly recommended for licence applicants under the age of 25 and with no competition experience in other motor sport disciplines to be accompanied by an experienced co-driver during the Provisional Licence period.

22. P-PLATE USE

Upon first issue, the PCC/PC circuit racing and PSK Superkart licences will be provisional and competitors will be required to display a P-plate as outlined in Schedule K – Markings on Automobiles, Article 2 refer to “General Requirements for Cars and Drivers” of the CAMS Manual of Motor Sport), until such time as an upgrade to **CC/NC** or NSK has been achieved. Refer to General Regulations of CAMS – Licence Performance and Skill Criteria for details of upgrade procedure.

Off road drivers participating in each of their first two club or multi-club events and also in their first national championship event shall have displayed on the rear of the car a P-plate as described in Schedule K, Article 2 (see “General Requirements for Cars and Drivers”). Refer to General Regulations of CAMS – Licence Performance and Skill Criteria for details of upgrade procedure.

23. UPGRADE PROCEDURES

For upgrade conditions refer to Licence Performance and Skill Criteria, General Regulations of CAMS. A CAMS Official’s Trainee licence must be obtained to undertake trackside participation.

24. INTERNATIONAL LICENCES

Regardless of the form of licence held, Australian nationals participating in international competition overseas must also hold a CAMS-issued visa which authorises them to participate in the competition noted on the visa.

The highest forms of licence issued are International A, B or C Driver’s Licence, which are required to compete in races of international status both in Australia and overseas. To be eligible for an International C

licence, drivers must have:

- held a Level NC circuit racing licence prior to seeking an International C licence;
- competed in at least five CAMS National circuit racing meetings during the previous 24 months, and at each have given notice to the Clerk of the Course of a request for observation for the purpose of upgrade to a Level IC licence;
- satisfactorily completed an annual medical examination. ~~by a CAMS-designated medical examiner.~~

To be eligible for an International R Rally Licence, drivers must have:

- **held a Level NR or CR Rally licence prior to seeking an International R licence;**
- **competed in at least three CAMS State or National Rally events during the previous 24 months, and provide evidence of competition history, such as results, when applying;**
- **satisfactorily complete an annual medical examination.**

To obtain an International Rally Navigators licence, applicants should contact CAMS Customer Service on 1300 883 959.

For holders of Off Road Licences who wish to obtain an IR licence, they should contact CAMS Customer Service.

24.1 Grades of International Licences for Circuit Racing

- **Super Licence:** Formula One World Championship for Drivers.
- **Grade A:** Formula One, GP2, Champ Car and IRL and valid for all other events listed on the FIA calendar.
- **Grade B:** FIAWTC and GT Championships and other international circuit races for the categories and championships as may be specified in the regulations of the ASN of the originating country, and valid for all other events listed on the FIA calendar except those specified above.
- **Grade C:** FIA Autocross, Rallycross and Truck Championships and valid for all other events listed on the FIA calendar except those listed above. Drivers begin with Licence Grade C.
- **Grade R:** all “road” events (rallies, cross country rallies, hillclimbs and other events in which a separate start is given to each competitor) listed on the FIA international calendar.

24.2 Qualifications for Grades A and B

Applicants for Grades A and B international licences should contact CAMS Customer Services Centre prior to application.

24.3 Qualification for the Super Licence

Applicants for Grades A and B international licences should contact CAMS Customer Services Centre prior to application.

24.4 Licences for all International Hillclimb, Rallycross, Autocross and other Loose Surface Circuit Races and World and International Speed Record Attempts

An International C licence is required.

24.5 Licences for Truck Racing

The Grade B licence is required for the FIA Championship races for the Super Race Trucks; the Grade C licence is required for all International truck races. Results achieved in truck races are not necessarily valid to qualify for a higher grade of licence.

24.6 Licences for International Historic Events

CAMS has the provision to grant two types of Historic International driver's licences.

- (i) A CAMS Historic International driver's licence, Level H1, allows the holder to compete in any International Historic competition in any historic vehicle, with the exception of FIA-classified Thoroughbred Grand Prix Cars.

To qualify for this licence the driver must be the holder of a current CAMS NC licence, and must have competed in three Historic race meetings during the previous 12 months. At each of these three meetings the driver must request from the Chief Steward an observation for the purpose of obtaining an Historic International licence. The licence shall be endorsed at each of these three meetings at the discretion of the Chief Steward.

- (ii) A CAMS Historic International driver's licence, Level H4, can be issued to any person who currently competes in Regularity events on a CAMS Level 2 or higher licence. This licence will allow the driver to compete in FIA International Historic Regularity Rallies only.

The FIA medical requirements with regard to medical examinations shall apply to the issuing of both licences.

25. LEVEL ISK - INTERNATIONAL KART LICENCES

The conditions for granting a Level IS international Kart licence differ slightly from those for Level IC international licences.

The driver must be the holder of a Level NSK CAMS Licence.

The driver must have been classified and obtain an endorsement on his record by an appropriate CAMS official in at least five events in the 12 months prior to application.

The grades of International Driver's licences for circuit races are as follows, according to the categories of karts and events:

- **A - Formula Super-A, Formula-A, Formula-C, Formula-E;**
- **B - Intercontinental - A/B/C/E, Formula-E;**
- **C - Intercontinental - A/B/C/E, Formula-E.**
- **Drivers will begin with Licence C.**

A superior grade of licence is valid for any lesser category of kart.

Upgrading from C to B will only be allowed after the driver has been classified among the first five in at least five National Championship or International events within the 12 months prior to his application.

Upgrading from B to A can only be made on the basis of the following results:

At least three results within the 12 months prior to his application from the following qualifications:

- placed in the final of an CIK/FIA International Championship, Trophy or Cup;
- to have been placed in the first three of the National Championship;
- to have been placed in the first three of an open International event;
- as from 1994 to be placed in the final of the Challenge Shell Asia Zone and 1993 Japan Grand Prix. From time to time the CIK/FIA may include other events which may be used for qualifying.

Having obtained an ISK international licence, drivers must participate in at least one International or two National events per 12-month period or be observed to the satisfaction of CAMS during practice for the first event. Should drivers not participate in an International race for three years or more, they must re-apply for an ISK International licence.

Waiver for driver's International "A" Licence CIK/FIA:

The system of qualification for a CIK/FIA International "A" Licence will remain unchanged. (Refer Appendix "B" CIK/FIA Manual.) However, in exceptional cases, CAMS may put forward candidates who, in their opinion, justify the granting of the licence.

In order for these cases to be studied, the CIK/FIA has introduced a Group 1 Commission of two Vice-Presidents, which will be under the Chairmanship of the President of the CIK/FIA; the Chairman will have the casting vote. Decisions taken by this Commission will be final and there will be no appeal.

When putting forward a candidate to the CIK/FIA (not later than 30 days prior to the closing date of entries of the event for which he would need his licence), the candidate must submit written evidence to CAMS in support of the application (the driver's results obtained within the 12 months prior to the application) and indicate the Championship for which an "A" Licence CIK/FIA is required and which the applicant intends to enter should he be granted the licence. In the case a driver does not enter and participate in the Championship, the waiver will be automatically cancelled.

The CIK/FIA will establish the list of Licence "A" drivers, which shall be the only valid list.

26. OVERSEAS PARTICIPATION IN CAMS NATIONAL EVENTS

Refer to www.cams.com.au.
